



Restroom Trailer Buyer's Guide

Use this guide to choose the right luxury restroom trailer for your event or job. It walks through capacity, layout, accessibility, power and water needs, and which models fit common use cases like weddings, corporate events, festivals, construction offices, and film sets.

1. Start With Your Event or Site Type

- Weddings and private events – focus on guest experience, finishes, and privacy.
- Corporate and VIP events – look for upscale interiors, separate men's and women's rooms, and climate control.
- Festivals and large crowds – prioritize capacity, durability, and service access.
- Construction office and long-term use – consider simple, durable interiors and easy servicing.
- Film and production – prioritize base camp layout, VIP/talent restrooms, and unit moves.

2. Estimate Guest or User Count

Your total headcount and event duration are the biggest drivers of the trailer size you need. Share realistic numbers with Pottys Plus so we can recommend the right mix of trailers and portable restrooms.

- Note peak headcount, not just average attendance.
- Consider staff, vendors, and crew in addition to guests.
- For multi-day events, plan around the busiest time block.

3. Understand Trailer Sizes and Layouts

- Smaller 2–3 station trailers – great for intimate events, VIP areas, or smaller guest counts.
- Mid-size 4–5 station trailers – ideal for average-size weddings and corporate events.
- Larger 8–10 station trailers – best for festivals, big corporate events, and high-traffic uses.
- ADA-compliant trailers – required when you need fully accessible, ramped restrooms with turning radius inside.

4. Accessibility & ADA Considerations

Plan for accessibility from the start. Many events and public gatherings must provide accessible facilities. Even when not strictly required, ADA-compliant trailers and accessible paths make the

experience better for everyone.

- Confirm whether your event requires ADA-compliant restrooms or ADA-style accessibility.
- Plan an accessible route from parking or seating areas to the trailer.
- Allow space for ramps, landings, and maneuvering at the trailer doors.

5. Power, Water, and Site Requirements

Every restroom trailer needs the right support to operate. Talk to your venue or site contact early so they understand the requirements and where the trailer will park.

- Power – most trailers need dedicated 20-amp electrical circuits; generators are an option for remote sites.
- Water – on-site garden hose water is preferred for maximum capacity, but onboard tanks and water truck options are available.
- Access – ensure a clear path for the delivery truck and a level parking area for the trailer.

6. Matching Trailers with Events

- Backyard or barn wedding – a mid-size luxury trailer with upscale finishes is often ideal.
- Corporate appreciation event – consider a larger trailer with separate entrances for men and women.
- Festival or fair – use one or more larger trailers backed up by standard portable units and handwash stations.
- Film production – mix trailers for VIP/talent and standard units for crew, plus handwash for catering and crafty.
